What's the Door County Folk Festival (DCFF)? – www.dcff.net

DCFF is one of the most fun-filled, enjoyable and educational dance weekends in the Midwest, attracting hundreds of participants to NE Wisconsin, from all around the U.S., Canada and beyond. The Festival features workshops in ethnic folk dance, contra/square dance, and ethnic singing, as well as culture sessions, musician jam sessions, youth activities, a BYO Dessert Social Hour, a traditional Door County Fish Boil Dinner, a Silent Auction Benefit and more. Workshops are led by some of the best regional special guest instructors and callers; and there are dance parties every night.

What's the commitment?

Work Scholars commit to levels ranging between full-time and part-time. We require the equivalent of between six and eight full-time work scholars. A full-time commitment (the entire weekend) is between 10-15 hours. A rule of thumb is that you will be busy 25% to 33% of the time.

What's the reward?

Work scholars work hard, play hard and make the administration of the festival seem easy. In exchange for a mutually agreed upon level of work, Work Scholars receive a complimentary weekend pass, and discounts on lodging and other festival merchandise (CDs, Dance Notes, T-Shirts, etc.) Lodging is with another Work Scholar in a room with two beds. The cost of lodging is based on the how many nights you stay and your level of contribution. The work scholar program does not cover transportation costs or other meals and incidentals. For returnees, scholarships are awarded based on prior years' performance. For first timers scholarships are awarded based on the Team Leaders' reviews of applications.

How do I apply?

If you're ready to commit, you should contact the Work Scholar Team ASAP. We will need both full-time and part-time scholars. Please be clear as to whether you are applying for a full-time or part-time position. Full-time usually requires being present at setup (Wednesday) or clean-up (Monday) but not necessarily both. Exceptions can be discussed. If you'd like further clarification or are ready to apply, contact the Work Scholar Team Leaders (see below):
